Dear Supporters and Praying Friends,

I hope this letter finds each of you doing well. We are now in our 16<sup>th</sup> year of helping men. March 1, 2010, is when I went to a nearby prison and picked up the first man we had. His name was Chris. We have seen well over 200 men come through the doors of Fair Haven Home for Men since that first man came.

Justin is still working for the same company. He has bought a truck and found a nice place to live. Patrick had his cataract surgery, was able to get his driver's license, and is now working in a plant in our area. Gage has also gotten his driver's license and has also started working at the same plant.

We have Mike from GA. He was a former police captain. Brandon came to us from NC, and Jamie came a few weeks back and is from SC. We rejoice that these three men would come to Fair Haven to let us help them.

We have seen men so overwhelmed by addiction. They can't sleep and have sores all over their body. Many times, they are not able to think straight, are sick to their stomach every day, and have the shakes so bad that they can hardly hold a cup of water. We bandage them up, love and care for them, and help them rebuild a life that has been stripped out of their hands. They come to us with no driver's license, no social security cards, and many without birth certificates. They have no clothes, worn out shoes, diabetes, and have not taken their medicine in a long time. Some have other physical problems and cannot afford to go to a doctor. Financial problems are mounted up to the ceiling. How does Fair Haven deal with all this trouble? One thing at a time. We go to the thrift store and Walmart and get them some clothes and shoes. We get them a good haircut and all they need to get cleaned up. We have a clinic that helps with medical issues and dental issues. We get them in the Word of God and help them understand that God cares about them and is interested in their lives and wants the best for them. We explain Christ's love to go to Calvary, and all that was for them because He cares for them.

I am still working on the tiny homes. We have about \$20,000 in savings to go toward that project. I will be getting on the road a lot more to represent the home in new churches and raise our support level. The cost of everything has gone up' so I will be back on the phone trying to get into new churches and raise additional support for the home and also raise more funding for the tiny home project.

Thank you so much for your financial support and prayer support for the Home as we press forward in the ministry of rescuing men's lives. One reached is worth it all.
